### SECTION 4. FIRST-AID MEASURES

#### First-aid Measures

##### Inhalation

Remove source of exposure or move to fresh air. Get medical advice or attention if you feel unwell or are concerned.

##### Skin Contact

##### Eye Contact

Immediately rinse the contaminated eye(s) with lukewarm, gently flowing water for 15-20 minutes, while holding the eyelid(s) open. Remove contact lenses, if present and easy to do. Take care not to rinse contaminated water into the unaffected eye or onto the face. If eye irritation persists, get medical advice or attention.

##### Ingestion

Rinse mouth with water. Never give anything by mouth if person is rapidly losing consciousness, or is unconscious or convulsing. Do not induce vomiting. If vomiting occurs naturally, lie on your side in the recovery position. Rinse mouth with water again. Immediately call a Poison Centre or doctor.

## Extinguishing Media

### Suitable Extinguishing Media

## Special Protective Equipment and Precautions for Fire-fighters

Approach fire from upwind to avoid hazardous vapours or gases. Fight fire from a safe distance or a protected location. Do NOT apply water directly to spill. Knock down vapours or gases with water fog or fine water spray. Before entry, especially into confined areas, use an appropriate monitor to check for: toxic gases or vapours. Dike and recover contaminated water for appropriate disposal. Review Section 6 (Accidental Release Measures) for important information on responding to leaks/spills.

Fire-fighters should enter area wearing specialized protective equipment. (Bunker Gear will not provide adequate protection.) chemical protective clothing (e.g. chemical splash suit) and positive pressure SCBA may be necessary.

## SECTION 6. ACCIDENTAL RELEASE MEASURES

### Personal Precautions, Protective Equipment, and Emergency Procedures

Do not touch damaged containers or spilled product unless wearing appropriate protective equipment. Use the personal protective equipment recommended in Section 8 of this safety data sheet. Increase ventilation to area or move leaking container to a well-ventilated and secure area. Remove or isolate incompatible materials as well as other hazardous materials.

### Environmental Precautions

Do not allow into any sewer, on the ground or into any waterway. If the spill is inside a building, prevent product from entering drains, ventilation systems and confined areas. Minimize the use of water to prevent environmental contamination.

### Methods and Materials for Containment and Cleaning Up

Review Section 7 (Handling) of this safety data sheet before proceeding with clean-up.

Small spills or leaks: stop or reduce leak if safe to do so. Contain and soak up spill with absorbent that does not react with spilled product. (e.g. Sand, dirt, vermiculite) cover the spill surface with the appropriate type of foam to reduce the release of vapour. Place used absorbent into suitable, covered, labelled containers for disposal. Contaminated absorbent poses the same hazard as the spilled product.

Large spills or leaks: dike spilled product to prevent runoff. Knock down vapour with fog or fine water spray. Remove or recover liquid using pumps or vacuum equipment. Flush spill area. Dike and recover contaminated water for appropriate disposal.

Store recovered product in suitable containers that are: covered. Review Section 13 (Disposal Considerations) of this safety data sheet. Contact emergency services and manufacturer/supplier for advice.

## SECTION 7. HANDLING AND STORAGE

### Precautions for Safe Handling

Obtain special instructions before use. Avoid breathing in this product. Do not get in eyes, on skin or on clothing. Do not swallow. Avoid exposure during pregnancy and while nursing. Only use where there is adequate ventilation. Avoid generating vapours or mists. Prevent uncontrolled release of product. Avoid release to the environment. Immediately report leaks, spills or failures of the safety equipment (e.g. ventilation system). Avoid heating that will increase the amount of vapours. Prevent accidental contact with incompatible chemicals. Wear personal protective equipment to avoid direct contact with this chemical. Prevent contamination of surfaces that unprotected personnel may use. Keep containers tightly closed when not in use or empty.
